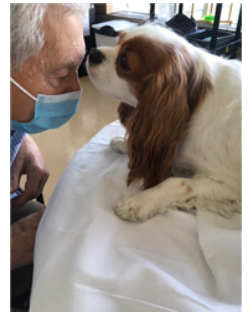

Ephemeris

September 1, 1944

Dieppe, France, was liberated by the 2nd Canadian Division, which had been badly hit in the disastrous raid of August 1942. A large victory parade follows.

September 7, 1955

HMCS Sioux returns home from the U.S. Naval Base at Yokosuka, Japan, ending the Royal Canadian Navy's involvement in the Korean War.

September 8, 2007

Under fire, Lieutenant JHS Tremblay leads Afghan soldiers into battle. He receives the Medal of Military Valour.

September 10, 1939

Canada declares war on Germany.

September 16, 1939

The first convoy of the war, designated HX-1, leaves Halifax for the United Kingdom. Eighteen merchant ships are escorted by HMCS Saguenay and HMCS St. Laurent to a rendezvous in the North Atlantic with cruisers of the Royal Navy.

October 3, 1914

The first contingent of the Canadian Expeditionary Force of 30,000 sails from Quebec to join the war effort in Europe.

October 8, 2008

After an ambush in Afghanistan, Master Corporal David Richard Tedford leaves his vehicle in a hail of bullets to free a jammed gun. He receives the Medal of Military Valour.

October 12, 1957

Prime Minister Lester B. Pearson was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize for the creation of a peacekeeping force during the Suez Crisis of 1956.
